



- Secure insurance for buildings and vehicles



Secondary Counselor: Mrs. Welch

Provides academic, career, and social-emotional support to help students navigate challenges and prepare for life after graduation.

- Course Selection: Guide students in choosing courses that align with graduation requirements and their interests - CTE Program of Study
- Academic Planning: Help students develop strategies and set goals to improve academic performance and achieve graduation requirements.
- Intervention: Monitor student progress and intervene to address academic difficulties.
- College Applications: Assist with the college application process, including finding scholarships, signing up for SAT testing and test fee waivers.

- Goal Setting: Help students establish realistic academic and vocational goals to build a successful future.
- Crisis Intervention: Provide support for students in crisis situations, such as experiencing a panic attack, family conflict, or thoughts of self-harm.
- Mental Health Referrals: Refer students to mental health professionals for more long-term support when needed.

Senate Bill 13- Starting September 1, 2025, Texas Senate Bill 13 (SB 13) introduces important updates to our school library process. Here's what you should know:


- Parental Oversight: You must be notified of all books your child checks out, including title, author, genre, and due date.
- Opt-Out Option: You may compile a list of specific books your child should not check out using a provided form or via our online library catalog.
- Board Approval & Public Review: All new or donated library materials must be posted publicly for 30 days and approved by the school board before they become available
- Our entire online catalog can be found on our website under Academics and then Library Service.

After School Tutoring Program

- Runs from after school until 6:00pm
- Offers a hot meal, homework help, high intensity tutoring, and enrichment activities
- Partnered with youth sports and 4H, so their time with these activities count toward their enrichment

Measurable improvements in student outcomes between the 2023–2024 and 2024–2025 school years.

- Reading and Math scores have increased
- Average attendance has risen from 91% to 94%
- Student behavior has shown noticeable improvement

Additionally, students who consistently participated in ACE for two consecutive years demonstrated a 30% to 39% academic improvement.

Athletic Director - Kody Yeager

Extracurricular handbook - Can be found on <u>Brackettisd.net</u> under "Athletics Department". These expectations are year round including spring break, holidays and summer vacation.

Practice Expectations - Athletes are expected to be at every team practice. Those who cannot attend are required to let their coach know prior to the absence. If a student fails to inform their coach, they could be subjected to extra conditioning/missed playing time.

1st period attendance after a competition - Student athletes are required to attend 1st period the day after a competition in order to be eligible for the next team competition. Exceptions: Anything that may require a note from a Doctor, driving tests, SAT/ACTs etc...
